Psychosocial Survey

An anonymous and confidential survey of approximately 10,000 10 to 18 year olds will help us understand the experience of

violence and abuse amongst them.

Game Development

Young people will help us design a serious computer qame by contributing to its direction as well as making the game relatable to them.





The **game** will be played by a smaller group of 14 to 18 year olds, using surveys before and after the game to help us measure attitude and behavioural change.

Curriculum Design

The results of our work will lead to new specific sex and relationships curriculum content. that can be kept by schools and used to help young people understand and prevent
